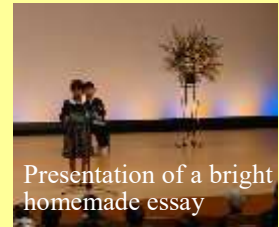

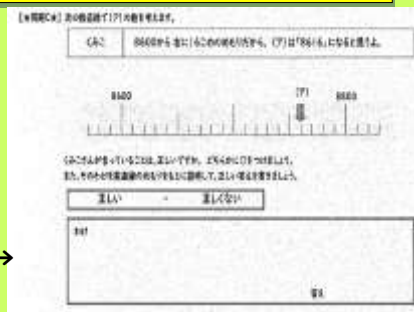


# "Principal's Challenge Problem"
