"Noto Peninsula Earthquake"

During the school assembly on February 29, we talked about the Noto Peninsula earthquake that occurred almost two months ago on New Year's Day. We told the students that more than 240 people lost their lives, and that some are still suffering from water shortages.

Next, I introduced a letter from a sixth grader in Osaka. The letter, which he wrote to his father who works for the fire department and was going to the disaster area, was posted at an elementary school that had been used as an evacuation center, and cheered up many people.

(Start) There were still small children, some of them babies, living in this cold weather. My heart ached when I saw them. I felt ashamed that I was sleeping in such a warm house after eating a meal and taking a bath. That is why I wrote this letter to cheer up the people of Ishikawa Prefecture, even if only a little. There may be people who have lost their families and are still recovering. I would like to go to Ishikawa Prefecture right now to offer my support. (Omission) You may still have to live in shelters, but please hang in there!!


During the reading of this letter, the children were listening very attentively. I am sure that they were each thinking about what they could do to help.



At our school, the Operation and Gathering Committee led a fund-raising campaign from February 27 to March 11. We are planning to donate the 13,205 yen we collected to the Ishikawa Prefecture donation office.
